At the time of the COVID outbreak, many Thompson/Okanagan associations were waiting for their City's opening of outdoor boxes and areas. Registration was ongoing and associations were working on solidifying teams, coaches and preparing for the regional scheduling meeting.

COVID resulted in a cancellation of the entire box season, tournaments and Provincials which North Okanagan was to host the 12U (PeeWee) division.

Due to the City closure of outdoor boxes and arenas, the region was unable to run any box lacrosse activity. As a result, associations worked through the difficult decision regarding refunds as players had yet to step foot on the floor. Offering full refunds was the choice of many of our associations, as they had to weigh the pros and cons of retaining any part of registration fees and how this would fair with families in our smaller towns.

Financially, several of our associations are in a difficult situation as many had made pre-season equipment orders as well as paying their operational costs and BCLA insurance. We are working on regional fundraising options to help our associations through this unprecedented time.

On behalf of Zone 2, we would like to thank BCLA for their tireless effort in communicating, providing guidelines and support to our associations to help us through this process. We would also like to thank all of our volunteer association members for your continued dedication and hours spent maintaining and growing this great sport.

We look forward to the full return of lacrosse.
